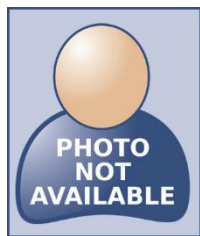
**Sarah Shook: Candidate for Class of 2028; School of Health Science and Education; At Large**

### **Rachel Lucas: Candidate for Vice President of Communications**

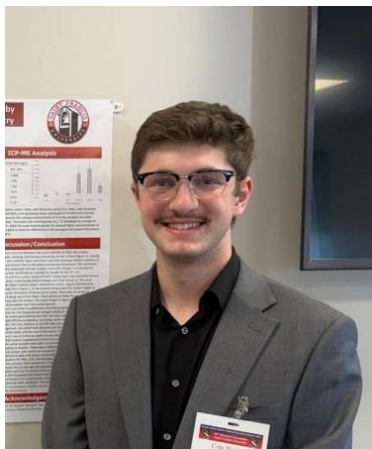
Hello,
