A.S. SUSTAINABILITY RESOURCE CENTER (SRC)

In 2014/15 the SRC served hundreds of students. The SRC hosts student driven sustainability activities. The center has a sustainability resource library, student research computers, traditional and non-traditional recycling, and a student study lounge.
