STUDENT ACTIVITIES & AFFAIRS SERVICES

STUDENT ID CARD

Process student ID cards, Activity Benefits stickers, and Transit Stickers.

CLUBS

All clubs are chartered through the Student Senate and an active list is available online and at the SAA office.

LOCKERS

The Kern Building lockers downstairs are available to students with a valid activity benefits sticker on their ID card. Lockers are assigned by the SAA office.

BULLETIN BOARD POSTINGS

Approval of all printed material for posting on student bulletin boards or for distribution on District property.

HOUSING INFORMATION BOARD

A bulletin board is located in the breezeway of the Sequoia Building. The SAA office maintains the housing board; however, COS does not screen applicants or those posting rental advertisements.

EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES IN THE QUAD

Student Activities and Affairs maintains the Master Event Calendar for Quad events. Any organization wanting to distribute information or hold an event must submit an Activity Date (ADR) request form or a Vendor Event Request packet two weeks prior to the event date. ADR forms must be signed by a COS club advisor, instructor, or staff member. (Fee Speech area is the area directly in front of the Moro Bldg. - across from the Quad area.) (Forms are available at the Student Activities and Affairs office.)

STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center is open to all COS students. It is located in the Giant Forest Building adjacent to the COS Bookstore.

<u>Cost</u>

- First Student ID Card: Free
- Replacement ID Card(s): \$5.00
- Note: students are issued one student ID card at COS. There is a charge for any additional cards

- Online in a students Banner Web account
- Paid by funds received from a Pell Grant

WHAT IS NEEDED?

- For verification of identity, students must have a photo ID. (*i.e. driver's license, recent high school ID card, passport, military ID, residency ID card, etc.*)
- If a student does not have a photo ID card then a Social Security card or birth certificate will be accepted.
- Students will be required to log into Banner Web or provide a Student Schedule Bill from the Cashiers office, so SAA staff can verify current enrollment status and payment of fees.
