

WHO QUALIFIES?

<u>All positions must meet the following requirements:</u>

- □ Minimum 2.5 GPA prior semester and while in office (3.0 for graduate students)
- □ Minimum 2.5 cumulative CSUN GPA right now (3.0 for grad)
- □ Enrolled in and earning a minimum of 9 undergrad or 6 grad units this semester
- □ Currently not on academic, disciplinary, or administrative probation
- □ Have been enrolled at CSUN and completed at least one semester prior to the election, earning 6 undergrad or 3 graduate units
- □ When seeking office, will not have earned more than 150 semester units or 125% of the units needed for a specific baccalaureate degree
 - □ For grad students, will not have earned more than 50 semester units or 167% percent of the units required for the graduate or credential objective whichever is greater.

WHO QUALIFIES? CONT'D

President and Vice President:

- Both candidates on the ticket are eligible to run
- □ The president candidate on the ticket has completed 60 units of college work prior to taking office
 - □ Has completed at least 6 undergrad of 3 grad units at CSUN
- □ The vice president candidate must have completed at least 45 units of college work prior to taking office

WHO QUALIFIES? CONT'D

Graduate Senator:

□ Must have a baccalaureate degree and be in good standing as certified by the office of the registrar

Lower Division Senator:

□ Must be a lower division student at the time of applying **Upper Division Senator:**

□ Must be an upper division student at the time of applying Academic College Senator:

Must have completed at least 24 unis of college work prior to taking office
 Certified as a specific major within the college being applied for
 Has completed at least 9 units within that college
 Unless in the College of Education

WHO QUALIFIES? CONT'D

After candidicacy:

- All of the above must maintain a minimum of 2.5 CSUN cumulative graduate GPA for the duration of their term.
- President and Vice President, must be enrolled in and earn a minimum of six (6) undergraduate, or six (6) graduate units each semester while in office, except in their last semester before graduation, when they may enroll in the minimum number of units required for graduation. •
- Senators must be enrolled in a minimum of nine (9) units undergraduate or four (4) units graduate each semester while in office, except when in their last semester before graduation when they may enroll in the minimum number of units required for graduation. ۲
- Candidates and Incumbents can not be on disciplinary probation. •
- Any member of the Associated Students holding any of the aforementioned offices who does not meet the above qualifications must resign within two weeks of notification. A.S. Executive Director can make an exception to this time frame •

CAMPAIGNING PROCEDURES

• What constitutes campaigning?

- $\circ \quad \text{Online Post on any social media accounts}$
- \circ $\,$ All of the campaigning will need to be done in a remote setting.
- \circ ~ In the Election code it states:

Natural Disaster/Emergency Section:

A. Once CSUN has declared an emergency on campus and moved into a remote setting, <u>all</u> <u>campaigning shall be held remotely until being allowed back on campus.</u>

D. The sitting AS President and Vice President should not be allowed to endorse a candidate during the elections. Except if they re-run again they can endorse themselves/their own slate.

CAMPAIGNING PROCEDURES CONT'D

Election code:

 A "no-campaigning" zone exists 40 feet from every outside polling station, A.S related event, the Associated Students offices, <u>and on all AS social media</u> <u>accounts.</u>



CAMPAIGNING PROCEDURES CONT'D

- Independent candidates may not appear on campaign literature with any other candidate or slate
 - Independent candidates can declare a campaign manager
- Slate names will undergo approval by the Chair of Elections
 If your slate name is denied, you will have one week to
 - If your slate name is denied, you will have one week to get it approved via email

Failure to do so will lead to me assigning you a slate name

Your ads must comply with all rules set forth by the Elections Code and Committee. All ads are approved by the committee before posting. Rejected ads will be notified and asked to resubmit.

INAPPROPRIATE ELECTION CONDUCT

- The Chair of Elections and Elections Committee have general say and authority over the conduct of the elections
- If you observe someone violating the elections code or CSUN policies, you can submit a formal complaint to the Chair of Elections via the formal complaint form
 - We will try and resolve the dispute informally first
 - You are expected to comply and attempt to resolve complaints informally
 - If we can't reach one, the elections committee will resolve the complaint

If they feel the need, they can decide to dismiss a complaint

INAPPROPRIATE ELECTION CONDUCT

- Ο
- You will be notified of your hearing date via text and email Both parties involved in the dispute may present pictures, eye witness accounts, or written statements during the Ο hearing
- Bring 10 copies of each to the hearing
 Following the presentation, the committee will ask questions and gather information from any persons present
- **THE COMMITTEE HAS FINAL SAY IN A HEARING AND** \bigcirc **CAN IMPOSE PUNISHMENTS ON CANDIDATES**
 - Candidates, slates, or campaign volunteers can be told to refrain from campaigning from an hour to two weeks
 - Disgualify a candidate or slate

CAMPAIGN FINANCE

- All candidates must turn in a Statement of Financial **Disclosure Form and Monetary Donation Disclosure Form**
 - Due Friday April 9th, 5:00 pm
 - Failure to do so may lead to ineligibility to hold office Must submit regardless of whether or not money was
 - spent
- Financial disclosure form must be accompanied by original dated receipts and invoices
 - Food given to campaign workers or potential voters, cost of clothing articles, literature, website maintenance, etc.
- Monetary disclosure form must outline the name(s) of the student(s), club(s), and org(s) and the amount they contributed

CAMPAIGN FINANCE

- MAX CAMPAIGN EXPENDITURES:
 - President/Vice President Ticket \$500
 Slate (excluding Pres/VP Ticket) \$1000
 Independent Candidates \$500
- MAX DÔNATIONS:
 - Individual \$50
 - Club/Org/Community Group \$100

FORGERY OR FALSE INFORMATION OF ANY KIND WILL LEAD TO PENALTIES AND/OR DISQUALIFICATION

WHEN CAN I START CAMPAIGNING?

- Right after this meeting ends!
- You are now an unofficial candidate
 - The Office of Admissions and Records will check your eligibility
 You will receive an email or text
 - You will receive an email or text notifying you of your eligibility, <u>check</u> <u>constantly</u>
- A list will be posted outside the AS Office with all of the eligible candidates, check to make sure your name is on that list



Campaign Resources



WITHDRAWALS

- Candidates must notify the chair of elections of their intent to withdraw in writing
- In the event of a withdrawal after the election results are announced, if that candidate that withdrew won their respective race, the seat will go to the second place winner

VOTING

- Only students who pay the AS fee will be able to vote
- Results will be announced at the IG live, unofficial election results will be online at csun.edu/as, posted outside the AS Leadership Office, and sent to the Sundial
- To win:
 - The president and vice president candidates must win a majority of votes cast in their race
 - The senators must win a plurality of votes cast in their race
- In the event of a tie, the instant Run-Off procedure will be used to determine the winner

CLUB COMPETITION

- With every vote, students can allocate one dollar to a club or organization of their choice
- You can campaign alongside clubs and orgs, you can campaign for them and they can campaign for you
- Election code:
 - Clubs and Orgs:
 - a. All of the incentives that will be used during the elections by clubs and orgs will need to be approved by the Elections Committee.
 - i. The advertisement of the incentives need to be separate from their endorsement of a slate/candidate
