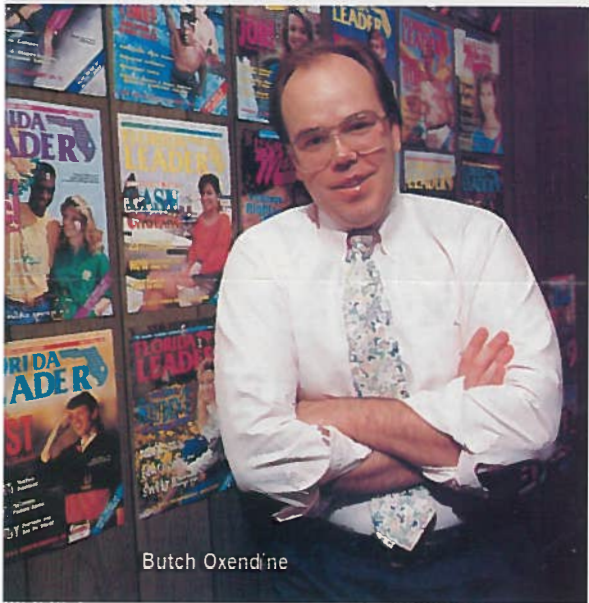

## Compensation

Two Florida student government leaders are among the highest compensated campus leaders in the country, according to a survey by *Student Leader* magazine. The student government president at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton receives \$13,121.72 in salary and tuition, second in the country among student officials at public colleges and univer-

sities behind only the Associated Students president at Washington State University, who gets a \$15,643 salary.

Meanwhile, the president of student government at University of Miami gets a \$19,140 scholarship for tuition. That's tops in the country for campus leaders at private colleges and universities and first overall among all types of schools.

Butch Oxendine, publisher and editor-in-chief at *Student Leader*, believes the student leaders "deserve financial remuneration. For many, it's a full-time job. Without pay, lots of quality leaders couldn't serve because they'd have to get jobs off-campus. A salary or scholarship allows all types of students, not just wealthy ones, to get involved on campus." □
