#### SGA SPENDING PLAN

- Met over eight months to discuss and develop a responsible strategic spending plan. In essence, the plan is to responsible spend down monies accumulated over a period of four years in areas of concern.
- The most important tool available was the results of the Spring 2008 Student Satisfaction Survey co-sponsored by SGA and Academic Affäirs. Using the results along with the core values of SGA and assessment information from focus groups, the following spending plan has been developed to address three major areas: leadership development, student life (i.e. recreational activities), and the sustainability of the new SGA.

#### SPENDING PLAN 2008-2009

Leadership Development-\$30,000

To improve and grow leadership training to all SFU students and groups through attendance at conferences, the I-LEAD program, and the enhancement of ELA.S.H. programming, iLEAD Speakers Series - \$7,000

SAIL/Low Ropes Course for Michael McGuire Park- \$10,000

Greek Life Leadership Development- \$8,000

- \$3,500 evenly divided among 7 Inter/National Organizations for Conventions/Conclaves
- \$3,500- Northeast Greek Leadership Academy for Presidents
- \$1,000- Speaker on Greek Life and Greek Leadership on campus

and in the community FLASH Leadership- \$5,000
