

#### **Referendum 1415**

Shall the students of Centralia College choose to increase the present voluntary fee of \$5 per student per quarter to \$10 per student per quarter. The fee is for the purpose of improving student programs, clubs, athletics, organizations, and activities. This action may be taken pursuant to RCW 28B.15.610 which authorizes students to voluntary impose upon themselves fees for student purposes only.

Justification for this request is a follows:

Current \$5 fee was voted on by students in 1996. Students needs have changed since then.

The increase for each student would only be \$15 a year.

Tuition has not increased for two years and this does effect the student budget projections.

Athletics, at Centralia College is significantly under budgeted in comparison to peer institutions

Start new programs such as the Study Abroad Program

Increasing orientation to include winter, spring and summer

Develop an online orientation

Increase diversity initiatives including hiring a staff person to manage the programs

Within the next three years add another sport

Consider increasing the funding of our clubs and organizations. Current funding structure has been in place since 1992.

Look at providing more extracurricular activities to meet the need of the student population
