Completed Projects

• Hire ASG Associate Justice

We had an open position on ASG due to low participation in elections. (1) Therefore we created a hiring process that was fair and diverse. We created a Screening Committee made up of students at large, including students from the Student Pluralism Committee. (2,3) The Screening Committee was created to insure more student at large input into the selection of applicants to fill vacant positions in the ASG for 2007-2008. The selection committee was created with the idea of increasing transparency, ethics, and overall broader student input in the selection process. The Screening Committee members where Jamie Jones, Marco Sanchez, Efrain Moreno-Slamanca, Brianne Wood, and Marc Amiscua. This represented the first time the ASG created such a committee. The Committee was chaired by ASG Chief Justice to insure fairness. However the Chief Justice did not have a vote and was only there to insure fairness.

The Screening Committee received training on ethics, fair hiring practices and fair interview practices. They received a copy of ASBCC Ethics Code and a copy of Missouri Commission on Human Rights Pre Employment Inquires information sheet. (4) We also established a rating system in which the screening committee could fairly evaluate each application. All applicants who met the minimum qualifications were interviewed. The Screening Committee evaluated the written documents along with the interview and chose whether or not they would foreword applications to the ASG Executive Board of Directors for further consideration.(5) The ASG Executive Board then interviewed each applicant and evaluated them in the same manner as the screening committee. (6,7)

After an extensive application and screening committee we hired Yoonmi Park as ASG Associate Justice. Yoonmi brings to the ASBCC Student Government over 12 years of student government experience from her native country of Korea. Since coming to BCC in the summer 2007, Yoonmi has maintained a very high GPA and is a member of Phi Theta Kappa. She is also very involved in other activities including working with the BCC Math Lab and as an officer of BCC Rotaract Club. While holding an officer position in BCC Rotaract Club she assisted with the screening of "The Right to Risk" as part of Student Pluralism Day, volunteered at Camp Goodtimes, a camp for children with terminal cancer, and participated in many other volunteer activities.(8)

ASG Training

As a team ASG has put in over 650 hours of training over the summer. I worked extremely hard with Gabrielle Bennett, Faisal Jaswal, and BCC Administrators and Staff to create a diverse training program that included hands on training in all different aspects. This includes training in Leadership Style, Ethics, Diversity, Bafa Bafa: A Cross-Cultural Simulation Workshop, Team Building Ropes Course, Food Services and Events presentation, Public Safety Presentation, Career and Woman's Center Presentation, Center for Liberal Arts Presentations, ASG Presentation and Club Introduction, International Student Programs Presentation, MCS Presentation, Technology Services Presentation, Youth Undoing Racism, Marketing and Media

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presentations, Department Tour, Courageous Conversations, Communication, Event Planning, Fiscal, National Certified Student Leader Program, Disabilities, Washington Community and Technical Colleges Leadership and Activities Institute, BCC Polices and Procedures.(9)

Eight out of Nine ASG Officers are also National Certified Student Leaders after completing a two day workshop and passing a test. This representations the first time in ASG History at BCC that we have Nationally Certified Student Leaders.(10,11)

• ASG Internal Re-Organization of Documents and Structure

In order to insure efficient and effective operations of ASG I reorganized and restructured the system of forms and documents. This included restructuring of the system of folders on the R Drive to insure all ASG officers had access to secure information at any time. We created and/or reformatted forms to be more transparent and accurate. Some of the forms are ASG BOD Agenda, ASG BOD Bill, ASG Desk Log, ASG EBOD Agenda, ASG Inter-Office Memo, ASG Official Announcement, ASG Quarterly Report, and ASG Team Meeting.

We also created a system where all ASG Officers will save all important information on the R Drive to insure security and safety of information.

Internal Communications is very important to insure the timely and team oriented approach to problem solving. I therefore created a regular weekly ASG Team Meeting. I also asked the ASG Judicial Board to consider holding Official ASG Judicial Board meetings to increase transparency and student engagement.

• ASG Year Long Goals

After consultation with Gabrielle Bennett, Faisal Jaswal, and Jean Floten, the ASG Board created our Year Long Goals. The Goals for ASG for 2007-2008 are:

- o Enhance pluralism and diversity efforts on campus
- Improve Communication and Transparency
- o Engage more student involvement in college governance
- o Improve resources available to students

• ASG Committee Designation and Creation

With over 25 college committees, 52 student position on BCC committees and 5 positions on ASG committees it is a daunting undertaking to serve on these committees. Each ASG EBOD Officer is on at least 5 committees. Each ASG Representative is on approximately 4 committees. Each ASG Associate Justice is on approximately 3 Committees. 13 Students-at-Large are on BCC Committees or ASG Committees. (12)

The ASG also officially created the Associated Student Government Legislative Committee to increase student involvement in legislative issues that affect students. Some of the goals for the committee are as follows (13):

- o Work in conjunction with the Bellevue Committee Legislative Committee
- Work with the Washington Student Lobby (WSL)

• Hire ASG VP of Finance and Communication

We attempted to hire a VP of Finance and Communication but received a low number of qualified applicants. We posted the position all over campus with Posters, 7 Bulletin Boards with Applications, Plasma Screen, All BCC FYI email, and word of mouth. We had the position open for three weeks and received only four applicants, of those only two met the minimum qualifications. Therefore the decision was made to close the position and re-open the position during the beginning of Fall Quarter to increase the number of applicants. (14)

• Complete Student Programs Remodel

The biggest project this summer was the Student Programs remodel. This is a \$196,000 project that encompasses countless programs and BCC departments and staff. I have worked very hard to coordinate with everyone and insure ASG and other departments can remain operational. We are currently in the process of the remodel and I am working hard to stay on budget and on time. However, the costs have become extremely high due to uncontrollable factors. The uncontrollable factors are; \$11,000 on fire sprinklers, \$8,000 on asbestos abatement, and \$15,000 in architectural costs. These are all costs that where not planned and or budgeted for. I am meeting with BCC VP of Administrative Services Laura Saunders to request that the college support students, Student Programs, and ASG and contribute to the projects costs. We feel that certain costs the institution should be bearing instead of students. We will be requesting

the BCC Administration pay \$32,000 to pay for asbestos abatement, architectural costs, and fire sprinklers. (15, 16, 17,18)

• Increased Student Membership on College Committees

We would like to increase the number of college committees with Student Membership. Our goals are to see all college committees and hiring committees with permeate student membership as outlined in the BCC Committee Policy.

The college is in the process of approving student membership on the Pluralism Steering Committee. I have discussed the topic with BCC President Jean Floten and will be scheduling a meeting with the BCC VP of HR to discuss the hiring committee. This is a topic that we will be working with BCC Presidents Staff and All College Council to complete. Some of the committees we would like to gain Student Membership on are:

- Distance Learning Committee
- o Educational Services Cabinet
- Web Steering Committee
- o BCC Hiring Committees

• Create Washington State Community and Technical Colleges Student Lobby

Currently there is no student group that represents student's interest who attend Washington State Community and Technical Colleges to the Washington State Legislature. I am in the process of collaborating with different groups around the state to create this group. At the Washington Community and Technical Colleges Leadership and Activities Institute organized by the Council on Unions and Student Programs (CUSP) in Wenatchee, Washington we had a student led discussion on this issue. We have created two takes forces to help lead the effort. One Task Force is to discuss legislative issues this year with the Washington State Legislature. ASG Legislative Committee Chair Brianne Wood is on this committee with students from Shoreline CC, Olympic College Shelton, Green River CC, Whatcom CC, and Spokane CC.

I am on the State Wide Coalition Coordination Team to assist in coordinating a state wide coalition that represents the needs and interest of the 35 Community and Technical Colleges 500,000 students. I have already created a Facebook Group to help coordinate this effort and am in the process of talking with the Council on Unions and Student Programs to create a website. Lastly, I am in the process of contacting Washington Student Lobby to collaborate with the 4 year college's coalition.

• Research El Centro Latino

I am in the process of collaborating with students of the Latin American Cultural Club, students at large, former BCC students, BCC Student Programs and ASG VP of Student Affairs and Pluralism to potentially create a El Centro Latino.

• Insure Success of ASG Officers

This is one of the most important projects and tasks I have. My success is determined by the success of my team. I work very hard with each ASG Officer to help their projects succeed and help them grow as an individual and a leader. I constantly make sure they have the resources, skills, and knowledge to make their projects a great

success. I will continue to meet with all ASG Officers on regular bases to insure their success and the success of ASG.

Completed Projects

• ASG Pluralism Plan

An entity within a higher education institution must integrate and create avenues for inclusiveness into its embedded values and work towards parity in education, diversity and student success. In order to work toward this goal, it was essential for ASG to create a Pluralism Plan outlining the priorities and strategies for the upcoming year. I collaborated with the VP of Equity and Pluralism on this plan.

• Peer to Peer Mentoring Summer Leadership Team

The Peer to Peer Mentoring Leadership Team was created to help the current program plan the events during the First Year Experience, Connect to BCC Open House and more. The Team was responsible for coordinating campus tours for all the seminar sessions, recruiting volunteers, and managing day-of activities. The team received tremendous feedback of the success these programs exhibited. I served as a member of the Mentoring Leadership Team.

• First Year Experience

Throughout the FYE, I had the chance to be a co-leader in a Seminar with Trina Ballard, Director of Outreach. This was a great way to engage with new students and encourage participation in student life activities. Our seminar group had great attendance and provided excellent reviews post session. In addition to leading the seminar, I had the opportunity to provide suggestions for questions to be asked on the survey distributed to all FYE participants.

• Advocate for Student Space for Bridges Club

In the process of the Student Programs remodel, I took the opportunity to bring up a need that the Student LGBTQ Pride Alliance brought forth in the 2006-2007 year. This need was a space to create a resource center for students about the issues facing the LGBTQ community with books, articles. After discussing with the rest of the Board of Directors, we were able to designate a space including a desk, computer and phone for this need.

• Hire ASG Associate Justice

In order to hire the ASG Associate Justice in a fair and equitable manner, the ASG Executive Board decided to start a screening committee with membership from the Student Pluralism Committee. This committee received training in ethics and proper hiring practices to ensure the same standard is followed in the decision.

• ASG Diversity and Pluralism Training

I provided input to Jacob Peltier and Gabrielle Bennett regarding the diversity training during the summer including the Peoples Institute for Survival and Beyond *Youth Undoing Racism* Workshop, Courageous Conversations Training with Former Assistant Director of Public Safety Elman McClain and "*But What if I Say or Do the Wrong Thing*?" disabilities awareness workshop with Director of Disabilities Resource Center Susan Gjolmesli and Dimiti Azadi.

- Create a "Diversity in the Workplace" educational series
 In an effort to educate the future leaders on the issues of diversity in the workplace, I envision creating an educational series in the form of a learning community. This will be a student lead learning experience with facilitation from an expert in the field.
- Increase engaged participation of students on the Student Pluralism Committee
 Last year the Student Pluralism Committee consisted of BCC employees, faculty, and
 staff and only some students. To maximize the learning and leadership experiences of
 students, the SPC should have majority student participation with the BCC employees,
 faculty and staff acting as guides and advisors. It is extremely important to get the
 commitment of the student clubs and organizations in order to ensure the sustainability
 and symbiosis of the committee efforts and those of the student clubs.

• Braille Printer

Last year the ASG began to research the potential of getting a Braille printer to accommodate the need of visually impaired students, faculty, staff, and employees. This will be a joint effort between Print Services and the Student Government. During the summer, we had the opportunity to see a demo of the current printer in DRC which is somewhat outdated. In the next quarters, we should be finalizing the details of the equipment and begin utilizing the service.

• ASG Pluralism Website

As significant research shows, companies and organizations most effectively managing diversity issues utilize multiple tools, one of which is the website. Due to this, it was important to create a section on the Student Programs website relating to pluralism. This will serve as a resource for students about what this office and the campus is doing to

address the issues of pluralism and diversity. Also, there will be a section that will highlight the signs of discrimination to further educate the students on how to recognize these instances.

• Participation in the BCC American Indian Film Festival

Through my experience with the Seattle Art Museum Native and Aboriginal Arts Council, I will be coordinating an art display during the AIFF screenings. The highlighted artist will be Steve Hapy and will be showing his work through both days of the festival.

• Road to Freedom Photo exhibit

Family Diversity Projects' newest exhibit, The Road to Freedom, is focused on children, teens, and adults with the full spectrum of physical, sensory, learning, and mental disabilities. Along with color photographs by Gigi Kaeser, the exhibit features interviews conducted and edited by Peggy Gillespie and the 8th graders at the Four Rivers Charter School in Greenfield, MA. The display will be unveiled during the Disability PRIDE celebration and will remain standing for two weeks. The passive exposure is expected to be 700-1000 people per day. In addition, programming can be planned in conjunction to create increased engagement.

• Active ASG involvement in Student Pluralism Committee and Courageous Conversations

To facilitate future growth and increased awareness of issues of diversity and pluralism I continually encourage the other ASG officers to attend Student Pluralism Committee meetings and be engaged in Courageous Conversations.

• Campus climate surveys

Campus-wide surveys for students will identify the issues that are relevant and important to the students at Bellevue Community College. These will be done both as classroom visits and random surveys.

• Club and program representation

Clubs and student organizations play an important role in the campus community by continually recruiting and engaging students seeking further involvement. For Student Government it is essential to be in touch with these groups and continually work collaboratively. I will be the Club Representative for the Latin American Culture Club, Black Student Union, the Student LGBTQ Pride Alliance, and possibly more. It is my goal for these clubs to work independently and collaboratively to produce quality events, build community and a better college environment.

• Research the formation of El Centro Latino

As the ASG Representative for the Latin American Culture Club I participated in the research trip to southern California in order to look into the diverse educational, cultural, and university Latino centers. After the trip was complete, the findings were used to collaboratively plan a creation of a Latino Center at Bellevue Community College.

Associated Student Government Logo Branding

We designed a new logo that represents both the Associated Students of Bellevue Community College and its Government. (21) This Project works towards ASG's Year-Long Goal #2 (2) which is to improve communication and transparency between ASG and students. This became the approved official logo of ASG and ASBCC which will be branded on all ASG documents, emails, and products. We hope that by using a unified logo and massbranding, that ASG could increase awareness about who, what, when and where and how ASG functions. I drafted four preliminary potential logos and presented them at the ASG weekly Team Meetings. It was cut down by two, critiqued, revised and edited. Finally we voted on and finalized the logo and sent it to Campus Activities Board for conversion to vector and logo finalizing. We have already begun implementing and branding the new ASBCC/ASG Logo.

Promotional ASG Point-of-Purchase Cards

With a new ASG logo, staff and new student enrollments on campus, it is important to welcome and inform the student body of the ambassadors, functions, duties, and responsibilities of the ASG. Point-of-Purchase Cards or POP Cards are an easy and effective method of doing so. This Project is working towards ASG's Year-Long Goal #2 which is to enhance communication and transparency between ASG and the students and goal #4 which is to increase resources available to students. It is a half sheet of color advertisement and information that can be easily distributed to students throughout the whole school year. (22) Our first distribution of approximately 5,000 was done on September 10th which was sent through mail in the new student package that Student Programs sends. The cost for the 5,000 color one-sided half sheets was \$575, approximately 19% of our annual printing budget. The next mass distribution will be for the Connect to BCC Open House where we will have set up a stand manned by ASG officers. We will be using the leftover POP cards from the new student packages. More copies will be printed for distribution and stationed in various areas on campus for students.

• ASG Monthly Radio Show:

We would like to improve the communication between students and their government officers. In order to do so, it is extremely important that the students have a very clear, unified, and consistent understanding of who, what, when, where and how the student government works. It is therefore necessary that there be a means and medium for students to get accurate information about how the government is acting or reacting to current issues and problems on campus. I am drafting a plan to have an ASG-staffed radio show on BCC Campus through the Bellevue Community College licensed 91.3 KBCS once a month/quarter for 30 minutes. I have discussed the possibilities and logistics with KBCS News and Public Affairs Director, Joaquin Uy. There is a spot open that ASG could possibly occupy once a month/quarter however it does require a minimum team of three volunteers. Volunteers would have to attend four free radio-training sessions offered by KCBS every Wednesday along with two other continuing education courses offered by BCC: Basic Broadcasting and Broadcast Audio Production. This requires a sizable budget for tuition and compensation along with extensive hours of scripting, planning, recording and production. The show would be prescript and approved on by the ASG which would then be prerecorded before the airing date. The topic will also be discussed and approved on by the ASG

ASBCC Apparel

In order to represent and improve visibility, I am working towards getting the ASBCC/ASG logo and the student ambassadors to become more apparent on campus with uniform polo shirts. Student Government will wear these frequently throughout the quarters to help students be able to see and recognize the people who serve and represent them. I have been working on and finalized the ASG logo so the next step is to digitalize it for embroidery and pick out shirt style, color and company. This branding technique is projected to be complete by the middle of Fall Quarter 2007.

• Communications Plan

I have assumed the Communications aspects of the vacant Vice President of Finance and Communications until a candidate has been selected and appointed to the position. Meanwhile, I am drafting and developing the communications plan for ASG. Formerly, ASG has not had a communications plan to regulate, maintain and ensure that all small and crucial information is process, recycled and presented in the most efficient and effective manner. This year, we will finalize and approve a plan which will be executed immediately by the ASG and Student Programs. The Plan is still in progress with its outlines in place. The Plan will be completed and presented to the ASG Board of Directors by the beginning of the Fall Quarter 2007.
