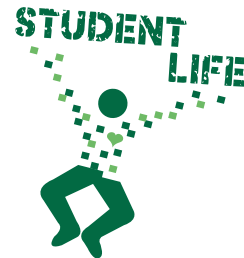

- become assertive in relating with others
- become better public speakers

What are the membership qualifications for Student Government Association?

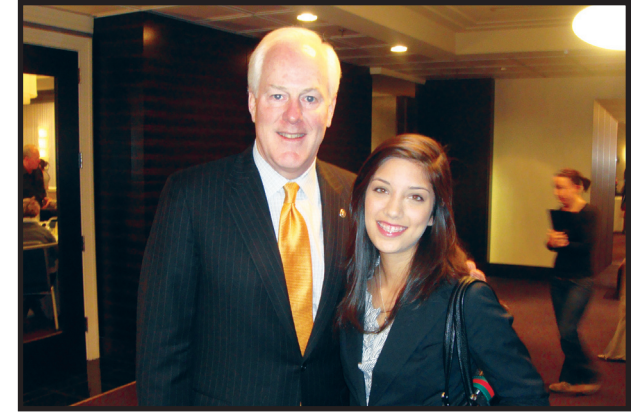
The membership term begins on the first day of the fall semester to the day prior to the beginning of the next fall semester. Anyone meeting membership requirements may join at any time.

Minimum Requirements

- Students must be enrolled at Brookhaven College
- Students must submit proof of enrollment in the form of a tuition receipt

Types of Memberships

- **General Memberships** – any student who meets the membership requirements. Membership requires active participation.
- **Organizational Representation** – one representative from each organization that is officially recognized by the Office of Student Life. Selection will be determined by each organization and approved by the organization's faculty advisor.



What are the offices of the Student Government Association and the qualifications?

The officers must meet all membership requirements without waiver. Officers must be enrolled in at least six credit hours, maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.5, and be in good standing at Brookhaven College.
