The student activity fee covers activities and services for the student body. Examples of some of the services funded by the activity fee include recreational sports programs, concerts and other forms of entertainment, student publications, the campus shuttle service, and student computer labs.

The student legal services fee is paid by all students and acts as a counsel to students and registered student organizations. The Student Legal Service may provide court representation to students and student organizations on civil matters.

The athletic fee is an essential financial supporter for the men and women's intercollegiate sports here at Eastern Illinois University. The fee covers a range of priorities throughout the athletics, from helping fund injury insurance, sports operations, full-time positions, game officials, sports medicine, equipment, marketing, Marching and Pep bands, Cheer Teams, and Pink Panthers.

The computer network fee funds the cost of the replacement of the total campus network infrastructure, including equipment and lines.

The grant-in-aid fee provides monetary awards to help students pay tuition, mandatory fees, and room and board.
