The Florida College System Student Government Association (FCSSGA) shall enforce the policies of the Florida College System Activities Association (FCSAA) along with the policies of the FCSSGA to all participants attending our events, retreats, and conferences. Any participant found to be in violation of said policies will be removed from the conference immediately.

POLICY 14 - TOBACCO AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE

The use of tobacco/tobacco-like products, alcohol products, or illicit drugs by any participant during an FCSAA activity, or in violation of the law or the participant's college policies, is strictly prohibited.

The Florida College System Student Government Association (FCSSGA) Student Code of Conduct Policy

All attendees are expected to abide by the following guidelines and responsibilities:

- To respect others- including roommates, accommodation staff and property
- To attend, on time, all workshops, seminars and scheduled events and stay on-site during the event (unless otherwise advised).
- To follow college, hotel, state and federal regulations/laws.
- To take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of self and others.
- To wear appropriate attire for each activity as suggest by the event sponsor.
- To reside/sleep in the accommodations assigned to you and by the curfew assigned by the advisor(s).
- To smoke only in designated smoking areas.
- To abstain from possession and/or consumption of any type of intoxicants (drugs and/or alcohol) between event departure and return times and to remove yourself from the company of anyone indulging in intoxicants.
- To report to an advisor or event/conference coordinator if you become aware of the possession/consumption of intoxicants or other breaches of the Student Code of Conduct.

If you choose to violate any of the guidelines/responsibilities listed, this will result in discipline procedures including, but not limited to: immediate removal from said event with no reimbursement of conference or hotel fees, and a letter sent to your college president explaining the violations.
