Procedure for Introducing Legislation

Any Senator may write legislation. All legislation, excluding budgets and funding requests, must be sponsored by a Senator. Then it will be read at a Student Government session and submitted to the chairperson or another member of the Constitution/Rules/Laws Committee. Once the legislation has been submitted, the Committee has two meetings to review and decide on its recommendation of the legislation. Within two meetings, the legislation will move to the floor of Student Government for a vote or will be returned to the Senator who sponsored the legislation with an explanation for the return. If the legislation is returned due to wording, the Senator may request that the Committee assist with the wording of the legislation. Once the legislation is re-written it will then be resubmitted to the Committee which will have two meetings to review the proposed legislation. If the legislation passes Committee it will be recommended to Student Government for a vote. Once the legislation is ready for a vote by the Student Government, the legislation must be introduced by the Senator who sponsored the legislation.
