I am sad that some of us will not be returning. Some of us are leaving and furthering their education at other institution, but some have left us for jobs.

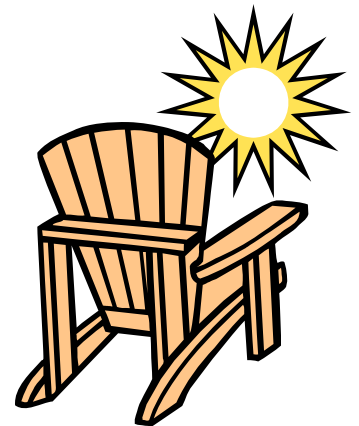
No matter what it is you are doing this summer or where life may take you. Good luck.
