

PURDUE UNIVERSITY NORTH CENTRAL 2015-2016 STUDENT GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVE PETITION

Responsibilities

1. Student Government representatives are elected for a one-year term. This term begins after the Honor's Convocation on April 17, 2015 and continues through the last day of the 2016 Spring semester.
2. Representatives must maintain a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
3. The Purdue University North Central Student Government is required by our constitution to meet weekly during the fall and spring semesters and at least once during the summer session. Attendance at these meetings is mandatory.
4. At the first official meeting of the new government, representatives will receive a copy of the Purdue University North Central Constitution. It is the responsibility of all representatives to read and become familiar with this document.

Petition Rules

1. Petitions must be completed and returned to the Student Government Office LSF 66 or the Dean of Students Office LSF 103 by **12pm Wednesday, March 18th**.
2. SIGNATURES appearing on the petition must be from students currently attending Purdue University North Central and CANNOT be from a Student Government candidate or current member.

The above nominee has met all grade qualification of the Purdue University North Central Student Government Constitution and will meet the requirements of the appropriate number of signatures on this petition. Students seeking to run in the election must have a 2.5 overall G.P.A. on a 4.0 scale with the exceptions of incoming freshmen or students transferring from another institution.

Campaigning Rules (*election will start March 23rd through March 27th*)

1. You cannot spend more than \$25 of your own money
 - a. You are allowed to raise up to \$150 (including your own money)
 - b. These funds must be from students, clubs, and faculty. (No outside donors)
2. NO Slanderous marketing of the other candidates.
3. You are only allowed to use campus media
 - a. PNN
 - b. Flyers
4. All marketing material must be approved by the election committee
5. You are allowed to use social media sites; however, they must be able to be viewed by the election committee:
 - a. Facebook
 - b. Twitter

If any of the above rules are broken it will be grounds for dismissal from the race.
