SGA Spending Plan 2008-2009

The Student Government Association has been meeting for over eight months to discuss and develop a strategic spending plan. In essence, a plan to spend down monies accumulated over a period of four years. Meetings have been held with the student senate, executive committee, advisor and other members of the University community. The most important tool available was the results of the spring 08 student satisfaction survey co-sponsored by the SGA and Academic Affairs. Using the results as a guide, the core values of the SGA (leadership, community and service) and assessment information from focus groups, the following spending plan has been developed:

Leadership Development -To improve and grow leadership training to all SFU students and groups through attendance at conferences, the I-LEAD program, and the enhancement of F.L.A.S.H. programming. Amount: \$30,000.00

<u>Freshmen Scholarships</u> - Three scholarships awarded annually to involved and engaged high school students who plan on attending SFU.

Amount: \$3,000.00 per year.

Upperclassmen Leadership Scholarship- Two scholarships awarded annually to deserving, involved and engaged student.Amount:\$2,000.00 per year.

<u>Campus Ministry Center Outdoor Community Project</u> - Funds to complete the project. Amount: \$16,000.00

Victory Bell Tower — DeGol Field House Amount: \$7,000.00

Leadership low ropes course- Michael McGuire Memorial Park Amount: \$12,000.00

<u>SGA Graduate Assistant</u> – Includes stipend and tuition for IUP Students in Higher Education Program Amount: \$18,000.00
