This award has two names. The Forty-Niner name originates from the university mascot, Prospector Pete. The award was created with the idea that we are all Forty-Niners. The name Gabrielino was added at a later date and is the Anglo name for the Native American tribe that once flourished in the lands on which exists the City of Long Beach. Native Americans have been coming to this campus for years, and students pushed to add Gabrielino to this award to show respect to this people. The award recognizes a graduating senior or graduate student for achievements and contributions to CSULB involvement in student organizations, leadership positions, and campus programs throughout his/her entire University career.
